


week of April 26, 2020





All the preparation materials related to organizing the always large - and ever-present - number of "things" which need to be done before a worship service takes place state that our April 26<sup>th</sup> service will take place on the Third Sunday of Easter. Note well - it's the "Third Sunday **OF**" - not <u>after</u> Easter. In fact, our celebration of Christ's resurrection from the tomb is not confined to one Sunday - but each and every one of our Sunday worship services throughout the year! Why? Because God <u>didn't</u> breathe a very big sigh of relief after resurrecting Jesus and say: "Whew! Glad that's over and done with until next year!" Rather as John 3:16ff reminds us, God gave His Son to the

world to save it - us - from ourselves - and whatever else may (and will) happen to come our way - including, flood, fire, famine and everything else not to exclude viruses old and new.

God's intent, purpose and message revealed to the world on that first day of the week and to us each Sunday when we celebrate the reality that God raised Christ from the dead - does not fade, wither or fall away like blossoms and leaves on a flower. Rather God's love, care and concern of and for us exponentially increases each days of our lives beyond our ability to understand.

Do you have some spare time on your hands these days? Here's a homework assignment from me to you to consider: Take a few minutes to find your bible. (If you can't find your own, ask your kids if you can borrow the one they received as a wonderful gift from CTSLC last year). Then read, consider and reflect on the contents of Romans 8:1-31. Once you've done that for a little while - go back and read verses 38 & 39 again - then say a word of thanks (many words would also do) to God in Christ and the Holy Spirit for being involved in your life.

Should your bible be safely tucked away where it can't be found, here's a cliff note version about my homework assignment: What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Christ Jesus who died and was raised to life is at the right hand of God and in intercedes for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Trouble, hardship, persecution, famine, nakedness, danger or sword?

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, life, angels, demons, things at present or in the future - powers, heights, depths, nor anything else in all creation - nothing - will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

#### **Confession & Forgiveness**

Pastor We begin In the name of the Father, Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Almighty God, to whom all hears are open, all desires known and from whom no secrets are hid; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. First Reading Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Today's reading is the conclusion of Peter's sermon preached following the giving of the Holy Spirit to the apostles on the day of Pentecost. The center of his preaching is the bold declaration that God has made the crucified Jesus both Lord and Christ.

Second Reading 1 Peter 1:17-23

The imagery of exile is used to help the readers of this letter understand that they were strangers in a strange land. Christians in this age no longer focus on things such as silver or gold but on our faith, hope and trust in God.

Gospel Luke 24:13-35

The colorful story of Jesus' appearance to two disciples on the road to Emmaus answers the question of how Jesus is to be recognized among us.

Here, he is revealed through the scriptures and in the breaking of bread.
