The "Rules of Engagement" for this Service Will Be as Follows:

- #1 If you are not feeling well (for as much as we'd like to see you) please stay home.
- #2 Participants are welcome to wear masks and gloves if you have them.
- #3 Absolutely **NO** hugging or handshaking will be permitted waving at someone will be fine.
- #4 Bring your own chairs and set them up 6 feet away from your neighbor (there's plenty of room). If you have a portable umbrella or tent to bring and set up that will be fine. It will also be OK for you to remain in your car during the service should you chose to do so we're working on the sound.
- #5 Communion will be celebrated using individually sealed wafers and cups served by Pastor and an assistant who will wear gloves and a mask.

Although the date on which CTSLC will resume holding in-sanctuary worship services has not yet been determined, the following guidelines have been established in advance of that date for your information and education.

CTSLC Post COVID19 Health & Safety Guidelines

Before The Service

- Service times will be published in the Cyberservant, CTSLC's web-site & outdoor sign.
- There will be a few new practices in place concerning physical distancing and hygiene.
- Individuals who are not feeling well should stay home until their health improves.
- Participants who have masks are welcome to wear them.
- All public spaces will be disinfected before people arrive for each service.

Worship Services will continue to be broadcast on Facebook

Preparing for and serving Communion

Altar Guild and Communion Assistants must:

- think of what they do in terms of food service preparation
- wash hands thoroughly for at least 20 seconds prior to preparing communion elements.
- individual communion cups will be used
- individual cups will be placed in every-other hole of each communion tray from which Communicants will take their cup without touching other cups
- all communion trays will be covered and placed on the altar as in the past
- Wafers will be emptied into the ceborum prior to the service without being touched
- The Pastor and communion assistants will wash their hands during the offering
- The Pastor will wear a mask and gloves, consecrate the elements without touching them and distribute wafers by "dropping" them into the hands of each communicant
- Communion assistant(s) will wear a mask and gloves, stand behind a table where communion trays are located and say to each communicant "the blood of Christ shed for you" as each person removes their cup from the communion tray
- a basket for communicants to place their used communion cup will be placed in a conspicuous place
- the Pastor and communion assistant(s) will commune last to make the congregation aware/confident that they are/have been attentive to hygiene practices

Greeters and Ushers:

- Greeters are to stand behind a table located at the front door, welcome and invite everyone entering the building (including children with help from their parents) to apply hand sanitizer from containers located on the table.
- Greeters and ushers should NOT hug or shake hands with anyone.
- Worship bulletins will be placed on individual chairs 2-3 days prior to the service.
- Offering plates will be placed on a table near the sanctuary entry/exit doors.
- <u>Inside and outside doors, bathroom doors and sanctuary entry doors will remain open</u> to avoid contact with doorknobs, handles or doorplates and provide for the circulation of air
- Passing of the Peace
 - everyone will be reminded to NOT shake hands or exchange hugs. A simple bow by all to the right or left will suffice
- End of service announcements will be made individually from the lectern
- Offering counters will sit at a distance, wear gloves and sanitize their hands frequently while processing the offering.
- Pastor will greet people as they leave but WILL NOT shake hands or exchange hugs.
- Worship bulletins are to be taken home by those who used them or placed into a basket located by the sanctuary door.

Pre/Post Service Social Hour

- Those responsible for pre-and-post preparation and clean-up of social hour refreshments will wear masks and gloves
- Only individually wrapped food items may be offered for the immediate future
- Self-serve coffee or canned beverages may be offered for the immediate future
- Only disposable cups, plates, napkins will be used for the immediate future





CALLING ALL YOUTH (8th-12th Grade) Fall 2020

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.

Registration - \$350

Estimated cost per child (after registration) - \$850 (Cost includes housing, travel, food, misc. expenses)

A \$150 nonrefundable, per-person deposit is due by Sunday, August 16, 2020. Remaining \$200 is due by Sunday, September 20, 2020.

Financial assistance is available for the 2021 ELCA Youth Gathering through the NTNL Synod via the process outlined below:

- Applications open May 18, 2020 July 1, 2020, and close when all funds have been disbursed.
- Financial assistance is available to youth participants only in the form of registration-
- Assistance is offered based on the financial need of youth participants and their families.
- Up to \$300 per youth participant may be provided to cover registration fees.
- Youth participants must be registered within 30 days of receiving financial assistance.
- Contact the church office 972-727-3191 if you want to submit application for financial assistance.

Youth & Family Ministry plans to subsidize expenses to reduce cost per child through budgeted funds and future fundraisers.


